The Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference has established a relief fund to support Western Alaska communities devastated by recent storms. This fund offers local churches and friends across our connection a way to respond with compassion and generosity.

The people of the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta are facing the aftermath of Typhoon Halong, while still recovering from the destruction of Typhoon Merbok. In villages such as Kipnuk, Kwigillingok, Kongiganak, and Tuntutuliak, families have been displaced, homes evacuated, and entire neighborhoods lost to rising seas.

Emergency partners are working to provide shelter and food, but the road to recovery will be long. Help is urgently needed.

To respond, OIMC is designating Sunday, November 16 as Alaska Relief Giving Sunday across all our local churches. There are two ways to contribute:
